REGULATIONS

SCHOOL HOURS.--From 9 A. M. to 12 M., and from 1:15 to 4:15 P. M.
THE SCHOOL BELL will Ring at 8:45 A. M. and at 1 P. M. **EXERCISES** will begin 15 minutes later.

PUPILS ARE REQUIRED:

1. To be Obedient and Respectful to their Teachers, Regular and Punctual in their Attendance, and Civil in their intercourse with each other.
2. To present a written excuse, properly dated and signed by Parent or Guardian, for Absence or Tardiness; likewise a Written Request in every instance in which dismissal before the regular hour is desired.
3. To be Cleanly in their persons and habits, and abstain from the use of Tobacco in or about the Buildings.

PUPILS ARE NOT PERMITTED:

1. To Loiter in front of or about the School Buildings; to bring to School any books or papers other than those connected with their studies; to play in the halls or rooms; to throw stones or missiles of any sort in the neighborhood of the School buildings.
2. To act in a disorderly manner on the way to or from School, as such misconduct will be treated as if it had occurred in School.
3. To Deface the Buildings or Furniture, to use Profane or Obscene Language, or to Quarrel. They will be severely punished for the first offense; for the second, suspended or expelled, as the Board may decide.

PARENTS AND GUARDIANS ARE REQUESTED

1. To visit the Schools frequently.
2. Not to send a Child with a Contagious Disease, as children thus afflicted will not be admitted.
3. Not to furnish children with Excuse to leave the School previous to the close of either daily session.
4. To insist upon Home Study: to sign each Weekly Report of the Pupil, and see that it is returned at the proper time.
5. To furnish Written Excuses for absence on all just occasions, and not permit their children to leave home before the proper time.

TEACHERS ARE REQUIRED:

1. To be in their Rooms before the Pupils are admitted and until all are dismissed.
2. To give careful attention to the Ventilation and Temperature of their School Rooms, avoiding extremes of Heat and Cold.
3. To report to the Superintendent those who are Habitually Neglectful of the Performance of their Duties and of the Observance of the Rules of the School.
4. To furnish each pupil weekly with a Report, which shall be a faithful and accurate record of the pupil's work to the best of her knowledge and belief, and to see that it is duly signed by the parent on its return.
